Lawnet materials are only accessible by staff and students of TP via dedicated lawnet PCs in the library.

Available via dedicated lawnet PCs – 2PCs at LRC Level 4 & 1PC at Level 5's Research Room. On the IE browser, click on "Favourites" and click on "Lawnet". Click on "Legal Research" tab, followed by "Reference Material" tab. In the "Reference Material" screen, you can select the category of your choice & enter the search term, such as for example "Copyright Singapore".
