Select the link for "Find journal articles", then enter your search terms or keywords using Booleans (AND OR NOT) to narrow or expand your search.

Don't forget to scroll down and limit your results to Full Text only, so you can read the entire article onscreen.

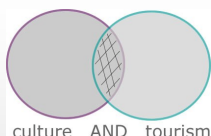

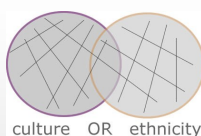

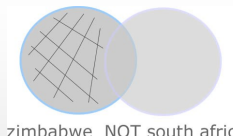

Abstract: The article presents information on the history of **Southern Rhodesia**, now known as **Zimbabwe**. **Southern Rhodesia** is an oddity in the history of British colonialism in **Africa** as it had no system of indirect rule and its "native policy" was not directed from London. The theory that African **cultures** and peoples had a Semitic origin had largely been discredited by the 1920s. However, its application to peoples in **Southern Africa** had a good airing a few decades earlier, in texts that were still influential among "native experts" in **Southern Rhodesia** by the 1920s. Information related to prevalence of racism in the African society is also offered in the article.
