

## **EBOOKS – FAQ**

### **1. What is an eBook?**

An eBook, or electronic book, is an electronic version of a printed book which you can view online. You can get the information you want, when you need it, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You don't have to go to the library to get it.

### **2. What are some features that are unique to eBooks?**

The entire book is searchable, including the table of contents, text, footnotes, appendices, and bibliography so you can instantly jump to the topics and phrases you're interested in. (simply type in your search terms using ctrl-f)

You can also choose to 'zoom in' on text to increase its size when you are reading your eBook (to do this, keep the ctrl-key depressed and zoom in or out accordingly).

### **3. Do I need a certain type of computer or special hardware?**

No eBooks can be read on any type of PC, laptop, or Apple Macintosh.

### **4. How do I find eBooks?**

The easiest way to locate eBooks is by following the link from the [Research Resources](#) page on the Library portal.

Alternatively, you can choose to browse our selection of eBook titles via [OPAC](#). To do that, choose "Special Collection" from the drop down bar on the top right hand corner of the screen. A fresh page will load and you can choose the eBook option from the listing.

### **5. Can I print or copy text from an eBook?**

You can make use of the Print and Copy functions on the browser window to print individual pages from your eBook. Users are required to comply with The Copyright Act and Regulations of Singapore when using library materials.

Yes. To access eBooks when you are off campus, simply logon to the eBooks site the same way you would when you are on campus.
